

A consortium led by Mirvac acquired the Australian Technology Park (ATP) site from the NSW Government in November 2015. Mirvac has taken over management of the site and the existing Locomotive Sheds. A State Significant Development Application for three new buildings on the site was lodged with the NSW Department of Planning and Environment in December 2015.

The rich historical character of ATP provides many opportunities to celebrate the significance of the precinct's heritage. Mirvac is currently working on the heritage interpretation stage 1 for the ATP site and is seeking input from the local community.

The draft Interpretation Strategy, which draws upon all of the interpretive planning undertaken at the site to date will be made available thereafter on the ATP website.

They will also provide an opportunity for questions and discussion of ideas, and possible innovations with respect to the future interpretation options and opportunities for the site.
